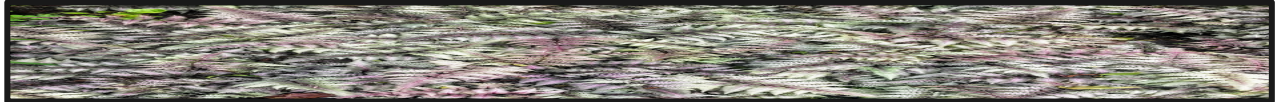


EXPERIENTIAL CONSULTATION GROUP NOW FORMING



Once- monthly format: 4 Sundays 3:30 -5 PM

This Experiential Consultation group is designed to help clinicians expand their clinical repertoire working with trauma. In each session, we will explore a range of tools and techniques that can be useful when “words are not enough.” We will engage in a range of experiential exercises to integrate didactic material and connect this to case discussion. This group is appropriate for clinicians from all theoretical backgrounds who desire training in experientially focused therapies including art/ drama (expressive), somatic (body- focused) and mindfulness (present focused) approaches.

- **Enhance your effectiveness** working with clients who may respond best to therapies that do not rely on “top down” methods
- **Develop new skills** using creative arts, the body and mindfulness practices
- **Connect** with a group of professional colleagues in a safe, supportive environment
- **Practice** self care for personal growth and effective practice

Tally Tripp is a Licensed Clinical Social Worker and Board Certified Registered Art Therapist with extensive expertise working with complex trauma. She is certified in Eye Movement Desensitization and Reprocessing (EMDR), Sensorimotor Psychotherapy (SP) and Intensive Trauma Therapy (ITT). At the George Washington University, Tally is Director of the Art Therapy Clinic and teaches a yearlong graduate level Trauma course. She also leads study abroad and professional trainings in Africa. Tally is a Fellow and Board Member of the International Society for the Study of Trauma and Dissociation (ISST-D) where she is the founder and chair of the Creative Arts Therapy Special Interest Group.
